## 1. Annual Quota

### 1.1 Overview

The commercial harvest of kangaroos is authorised by the Kangaroo Harvest Management Plan 2021-2023 under the *Wildlife Act 1975*. This plan requires the Secretary to the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Change Action (DECCA) to set a yearly quota. The quota is the maximum number of kangaroos that can be harvested commercially and under damage mitigation permits across Victoria. The commercial quota under the Kangaroo Harvesting Program (KHP) for 2023, is 166,750. For 2023, there are four KHP quota release periods, the first release commenced in January with the second release in April 2023.

## 2. Quota allocation – Quarter 2 release

### 2.1 Overview

- There are currently 170 harvesters authorised under the Kangaroo Harvesting Program
- From April to June 2023, 33,680 tags were allocated across the state which equates to 75.62% of the 44,537 tags available for Quarter 2, noting that the tags available for Quarter 2 included some carry-over from Quarter 1.
- Of the tags that have been allocated for Quarter 2, 21,188 tags have been consumed.
- Total number of tags allocated from 1 Jan – 30 Jun 2023 = 73,343
- Total number of tags consumed from 1 Jan – 30 June 2023 = 45,261

### 3. Harvest Information

#### 3.1 Overview

- Harvesters enter harvest summaries via a mobile phone application hosted by the Department of Government Services at the completion of each harvest job.
- As the harvest summary figures are self-reported, there may be discrepancies between the reported figures and the actual figures due to memory bias.
