### 1. Annual Quota

#### 1.1 Overview

The commercial harvest of kangaroos is authorised by the Kangaroo Harvest Management Plan 2024-2028 under the *Wildlife Act 1975*. This plan requires the Secretary to the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Change Action (DECCA) to set a yearly quota. The quota is the maximum number of kangaroos that can be harvested commercially and under damage mitigation permits across Victoria. The commercial quota for the Kangaroo Harvest Program (KHP) for 2024, is 155,650. Quota is released in four batches, at the start of every quarter. Where quota is not fully allocated, it can be carried over into the following quarter.

### 2. Quota allocation

#### 2.1 Overview

- Authorisations were valid for three years (2024 2027), for 2024, there are currently 113 harvesters authorised under the Kangaroo Harvesting Program
- From January to March 2024, 30,520 tags were released across the state which equates to 75% of the 40,600 tags available for Quarter One and 20% of the annual 155,650 tags available.
- Of the tags that were released, 13,974 have been consumed

- As the harvest summary figures are self-reported, there may be discrepancies between the reported figures and the actual figures due to memory bias
