## 1 Annual Quota

### 1.1 Overview

The commercial harvest of kangaroos is authorised by the Kangaroo Harvest Management Plan 2021-2023 under the *Wildlife Act 1975*. This plan requires the Secretary to the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Change Action (DECCA) to set a yearly quota. The quota is the maximum number of kangaroos that can be harvested commercially and under damage mitigation permits across Victoria. The commercial quota under the Kangaroo Harvest Program (KHP) for 2023, is 166,750. For 2023, there are four KHP quota release periods, the first release is for three months January – March 2023.

## 2 Quota allocation – Quarter one release

#### 2.1 Overview

- There are currently 159 harvesters authorised under the Kangaroo Harvest Program
- From January to March 2023, 39,970 tags were allocated across the state which equates to 94.5% of the 42,100 tags available for Quarter One
- 39,970 tags have been allocated across the state equating to 27.93% of the annual 166,750 tags available
- Of the tags that have been allocated, 24,637 tags have been consumed

Harvesters enter harvest summaries via a mobile phone application hosted by the Department of Government Services at the completion of each harvest job.

As the harvest summary figures are self-reported, there are often differences between the reported figures and the actual figures.
