## 1 Quota

### 1.1 Overview

The commercial harvest of kangaroos is authorised under the *Wildlife Act 1975* and undertaken in accordance with the Victorian Kangaroo Harvest Management Plan 2021-2023. This plan requires the Secretary to the Department of Environment, Land, Water, and Planning (DELWP) to set a yearly quota. The quota is the maximum number of kangaroos that can be harvested commercially in a year. The Kangaroo Harvest Program quota for 2022 was 127,850, however, as a result of ongoing monitoring this quota amount was modified to 118,980, removing the release of quota from the North East and Lower Wimmera zones for release 3. The first release period of quota commenced 1 January, with the second release commencing 1 July and the third and final release commencing 1 October 2022.
